

Water Usage and Restrictions - Residents are reminded that watering restrictions are always in effect per Bylaw No. 413 and that sprinkling (irrigating) lawns and gardens between the hours of 10:00 am and 6:00 pm is prohibited. The Village of Midway reserves the right to disconnect offenders from the water service for violation of regulations and wasteful use of water. Any service that has been disconnected will be charged a minimum of \$50.00 before service resumes. On your own well? Remember that all Village water comes from the same aquifer and your use also contributes to the lower water levels even if you don't think it does. We appreciate your cooperation.

**Burning Ban** - Residents are reminded that campfires are prohibited throughout the Southeast Fire Centre to help prevent human-caused wildfires and protect public safety. All other burning restrictions issued by the Ministry of Forests, Lands and Natural Resources Operations (Southeast Fire Centre) are still in effect, and will remain in place until the public is otherwise notified. The Village of Midway abides by all burning bans and restrictions issued by the Ministry.

This bans prohibits the following activities:

- The burning of any waste, slash, or other materials
- Stubble or grass fires of any size over any area
- The use of fireworks, sky lanterns, tiki torches, chimineas, or burning barrels of any size or description
- Campfires, as defined in the wildfire regulation

# All previously issued burn permits issued by the Village of Midway are now null and void until further notice.

The prohibition does not apply to cooking stoves that use gas, propane or briquettes, or to portable campfire apparatus with a CSA or ULC rating that uses briquettes, liquid or gaseous fuel, so long as the height of the flame is less than 15 cm. The use of a campfire apparatus that does not meet these specifications is prohibited.

Reduce fuels in this area by thinning and pruning vegetation

**Priority Zone 2**

Try to thin out trees and other vegetation. This will help reduce a THIN AND REMOVE CONIFEROUS TREES: apart, and remove any understory trees that Space dominant trees at least three metres wildfire's intensity and slow its spread.
