The Village of Midway Office offers all of your ICBC Autoplan and Drivers Services needs. <u>**Thank you!</u>** - On behalf of the Mayor, Council, and staff we would like to thank all of the volunteers who made Canada Day a huge success!</u>

**Fire Permits** - Residents are reminded that burning permits for campfires are required within the Village and can be purchased for \$1 at the Village Office. At this time, **Campfires only**.

Category 3 Fires and <u>Category 2 Open Burns</u> are now prohibited within the Village of Midway's boundaries.

No person shall ignite or cause to be ignited any household waste, refuse, rubbish, garbage, plastic, or styrofoam, industrial or commercial waste under any circumstances.

# \*\*<u>This restriction applies to all new and</u> previously issued open burn permits. \*\*

Any person who contravenes or violates any provision of this Bylaw could be liable to a minimum fine of \$500.00 and should the Midway Volunteer Fire Department/Emergency Responder be required, the Permittee shall be liable for the total cost of the fire call per Bylaw #451, Part 10, Sec. 51 (2) (3).

Water Usage - Irrigating of lawns and gardens is permitted between 6pm and 10am only. A full page flyer with information about water consumption and the sewer treatment plant will be distributed to all residents soon.

With that, we need to remind all residents who have a campfire permit that AT NO TIME SHOULD YOU LEAVE YOUR FIRE UNATTENDED. Even for a brief moment. You must have a responsible person watching the fire at <u>all times</u> as well as fire extinguishing equipment readily available (ie. garden hose, rake, bucket of water/sand).
