#### Walter Osellame, Ret. Fire Chief / Midway Volunteer Fire and Rescue

As most of you already know, Walt Osellame retired as Fire Chief for Midway Fire and Rescue on November 15, 2020, after completing more than 30 years of volunteer service to this community and to the boundary area.

Of his 41 total years in the fire service, Walter has served 30 of those as volunteer Fire Chief for the Midway Fire and Rescue service. This role comes with enormous responsibility, and Walt's proven leadership skills and professionalism, providing direction and the resources to his members has enabled them to do the great job that they do, he has given them the respect and the credit they deserve, and in return he not only received the respect, credit, and 110 percent from his members, he also got to see the positive results of all of his dedication, commitment and hard work.

In his career as Midway's Fire Chief, Walt has been instrumental in facilitating the development of this communities' fire service to what it is today, an active and exceptionally well run emergency fire and rescue service. Over the years constantly recruiting membership, ensuring the members receive the education, training and skills needed to be able to respond safely and with confidence to fire and rescue events. Establishment of up-to-date inventory of apparatus and fire equipment, instrumental in the expansion of a fire protection service into the Regional District Kootenay Boundary area of Kettle Valley and Rock Creek, and establishment of a road rescue service for inclusion into the department, another essential service critical to this area. This is an accomplishment to be proud of for sure.

While every Fire Chief deserves to be recognized for their dedication and commitment, Walt especially needs to be recognized and thanked for *volunteering 30+ years* of service, from November 5, 1990 to November 15, 2020 for the Village of Midway. This equates to 10,969 days or 263,256 hours of exemplary volunteer service to public safety, with no monetary remuneration ever requested nor accepted, all for the safety of our community, the surrounding area and the public.

This year, Walt was nominated for the 2020 Volunteer Fire Chief of the Year Award sponsored by the Canadian Association of Fire Chiefs (CAFC) and the Fire Underwriter's Survey of Canada (FUS) for his volunteer dedication and commitment to public safety. While he was not the Fire Chief award recipient, the CAFC and FUS recognized him for this dedication to service at their CAFC's Celebration of Excellence Ceremony held in September, 2020.

Michael Currie, Vice President of the Fire Underwriters Survey forwarded the following words: "It has been an absolute pleasure working with you over the years and I can't thank you enough for the tremendous work you have done for the fire service in your community, zone and across the province. You have improved the lives of many and improved the quality and access to emergency services throughout the area. The insurance industry and property owners that benefit from this thank you for your extraordinary efforts and dedication."

In October, 2020, the Fire Chief's Association of BC (FCABC) awarded and presented the Meritorious Achievement Award to Walt. *"In recognition for countless hours contributing to the training and education of firefighters in BC. Developing the minimum standards that guide the education of members, and for tirelessly organizing his Zone's training and education weekend."* This award is the highest award of recognition that can be bestowed upon an active or retired member of the FCABC.

We are grateful to Walt for the many years of dedication and commitment to this service, and we are also grateful to his family for their dedication and support all of these years.

Walt is one of a kind, we give special thanks and wish him all the best in his retirement!

Dear residents,


