Community Garden Bottle Recycling - This

beautifully, newly painted bin is where you can donate

your empty drink containers to the Community Garden. It is located on the corner of Cleghorn St and Seventh Ave, near the Arena and ball field. It is NOT FOR: garbage, plastic or paper recycling or anything other than drink containers that are eligible for a deposit refund. The amazing volunteers who sort and return the containers have



reported an increase in these materials being dumped here. Please only use it for its intended purpose.

Tree Recycling Facility - Residents are reminded there are only 3 keys for the entire community so please do not hold onto a key while you are working on your yard. Come pick up the key to the facility when you are ready to transport your yard and garden waste.

If you do not have access to the online version, please contact the Village Office for a hard copy. **Fire Permits** - Residents are reminded that burning permits are required for <u>campfires</u> within the Village of Midway and can be purchased for \$1 at the Village Office.

<u>Camp fires must be supervised until it is</u> <u>completely extinguished!</u> This means no walking away to let the fire smoulder until it's out.

No person shall ignite or cause to be ignited any household waste, refuse, rubbish, garbage, plastic, or styrofoam, industrial or commercial waste. The office door is still closed to the public but window service is available.

Please note that Open Burns are not allowed.

Any person who contravenes or violates any provision of this Bylaw could be liable to a minimum fine of \$500.00 and should the Midway Volunteer Fire Department/Emergency Responder be required, the Permittee shall be liable for the total cost of the fire call per Bylaw #451, Part 10, Sec. 51 (2) (3).

Level 3 Drought Conditions - Please note as of October 6th the provincial drought classification has decreased to Level 3. The Village of Midway is asking residents to continue to be water smart.

As recommended by the Provincial Government, we are requesting voluntary water use reductions of 30%. This includes both surface water and groundwater. It is necessary to meet current supply demands and ensure water remains in our reservoirs at adequate levels in case of a fire emergency. The title of "drought" will not be removed until it reaches Level 2.
