The Village of Midway Office offers all of your ICBC Autoplan and Drivers Services needs.

Tree Recycling Facility - Has reopened for the 2023 season. You can pay the fee at the Village Office when you pick up a key. Keys will need to be returned to the Office once you are done with it. The only materials allowed at this site are **grass clippings, noxious weeds or branches or bushes that have been pruned**. Since the facility has reopened, someone dumped a tarp and irrigation lines. Residents, please help us keep this facility open and only use it for its intended

use. Residents are encouraged to be vigilant if they see any suspicious behaviour and to call R.A.P.P (1-877-952-7277) to report any illegal dumping.



Spray Park - The Village of Midway is pleased to announce Midway has received funding for the Park Enhancement Project. The project involves the construction of a splash pad and washrooms at the James G. McMynn Village Park. The project has received support through the Destination Development Fund and the Kettle Spray Park Committee. The Province of British Columbia has approved the Village of Midway to receive \$555,215 for the Park Enhancement Project. Kettle Spray Park Committee raised \$16,700 for the Park Enhancement Project. The total project cost is \$571,915

Property Tax Notices - Will be sent out in the mail by the end of the month. The deadline for paying taxes and utility fees is **Tuesday July 4, 2023 at 4:30pm.** Any outstanding amounts will incur a 10% penalty. The Village can accept cash, cheque or debit (no credit cards) as payment. Post-dated cheques to July 4, 2023 are accepted but post-marks will not be accepted. Please remember that if you haven't paid for your Water and Sewer utilities that they are also due by July 4, 2023. Homeowner grants are being accepted by the Provincial Government again this year. Fire Permits - Residents are reminded that burning permits are required for campfires within the Village of Midway and can be purchased for \$1 at the Village Office.

*****Please note that Open Burns AND Category 3 fires are prohibited.*****

Camp fires must be supervised until it is completely extinguished! This means no walking away to let the fire smoulder until it's out.

No person shall ignite or cause to be ignited any household waste, refuse, rubbish, garbage, plastic, or styrofoam, industrial or commercial waste.
