Has reopened for the 2024 season.

James G. McMynn - August 7, 1930 — February 28, 2024

On February 28, 2024, in Kelowna, BC, James McMynn

passed away peacefully at the age of 93.

James was born in Midway, B.C. to Cecil & Ruth McMynn. From his early days at school in Midway, to his schooling in Vancouver, and through to his graduation from the University of British Columbia, he carried the spirit of his hometown with him. In the same year he graduated from UBC, 1955, on a crisp November day, James exchanged vows with Louise



Washington. Together, they raised five

children in the close-knit community of Midway.

James was the first Mayor of Midway serving from 1967 to 2005 and was passionate about building a community of opportunity. Upon his retirement, he was the longest serving mayor in Canadian history (38 years). Before he was mayor, he was on the school board that brought the high school to Midway. As a businessman, James was part of the lumber industry; he was vice president of Boundary Sawmills and also opened a local grocery store in 1978 named "Shop Easy". He devoted countless hours to serving others, earning him not one, but two Queen's Jubilee Awards for his outstanding contributions to the welfare of Midway and its residents. He was a devoted husband and father. James loved to curl and he was a big supporter of the Boundary District Curling Club. He was also a regular at the high school in the evenings, where he would play badminton. When he could get away, he travelled the globe. He loved to travel.

James McMynn's legacy endures. In life, James McMynn's presence was pleasant and sociable. In death, he lives on in the countless lives he enriched with his kindness and laughter.

A graveside service will take place on, SUNDAY, MARCH, 24, 2024, at 12:00 NOON, at the VILLAGE OF MIDWAY CEMETERY: Midway, BC. A reception at the Community Centre in Midway will follow the graveside service.

Midway Partnership Fund - Will be accepting Letters of Intent for 2024 grant funding until April 30, 2024. Information and forms can be picked up from the Village Office.

Tree Recycling Facility - Has reopened for the 2024 season. You can pay the \$10 fee at the Village Office when you pick up a key. Keys will need to be returned to the Office once you are done with it. The only materials allowed at this site are **branches or bushes that have been pruned with a diameter of 6" or less.**

Bylaw Officer Report - The Village of Midway has heard the public's concerns regarding barking dogs, off-leash dogs and pet owners failing to pick up after their pets and is responding accordingly.

Pursuant to the Village of Midways' Animal Control Bylaw No. 438 dogs, cats or animals are required to be leashed at all times in the Village. In addition, the owner of a dog, cat or animal must not allow or permit the dog, cat or animal to leave or deposit excrement on any public or private property, other than that of the property of the owner.

Owners of dogs or cats or animals within the Village must not allow or permit the animal to disrupt the quiet, rest, peace and enjoyment of residents in the vicinity of where the dog, cat or animal resides.

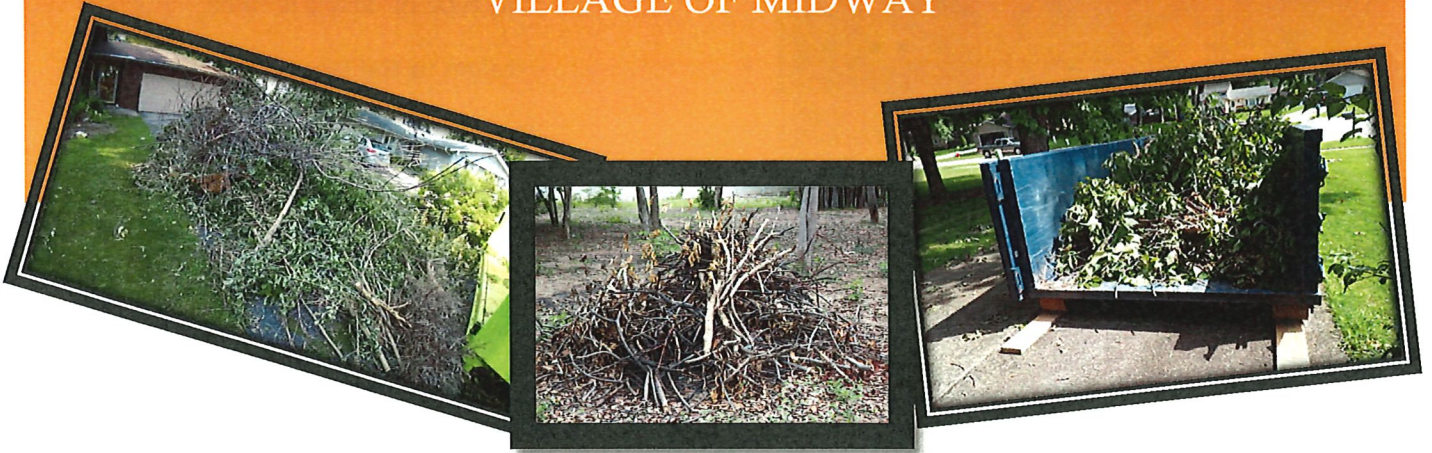
Animal Control Bylaw No. 438 was adopted in April 2012, and with spring upon us and the addition of the new spray park, a gentle reminder to residents to comply is important.

Stronger enforcement measures will be taken to encourage voluntary compliance of Animal Control Bylaw No. 438, and, in certain cases, the Village may be levying fines to enforce compliance for the safety of all residents. Schedule A of Bylaw No. 438 outlines the penalties that can be enforced by the Bylaw Enforcement Officer. Fines range from \$50 to a maximum of \$200.

The vast majority of animal owners are very responsible, however it is important that the Village of Midway takes steps to enforce its existing bylaws to ensure all residents and visitors to the Village of Midway have a positive and enjoyable experience when encountering animals within the Village.

VILLAGE OF MIDWAY

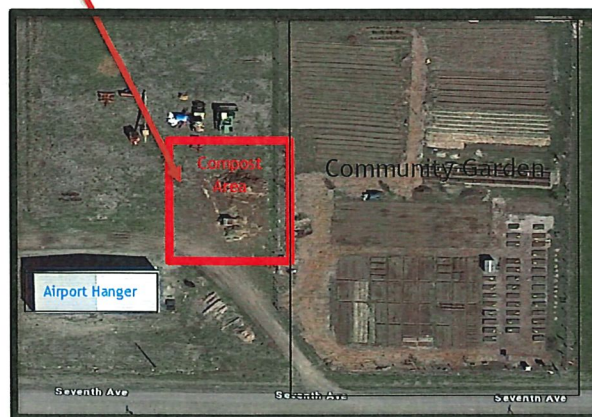


The Tree Recycle facility is only for trees, branches and twigs only.

Trees and branches are LIMITED to a maximum diameter of 6 inches

Grass, leaves, and sod can be taken to the Community Garden's compost pile

No large trees, stumps or root wads allowed





No lumber or construction debris

This type of debris is to be taken to the landfill in Rock Creek or Greenwood

No rocks, concrete, or soil



No grass, leaves or sod waste

This type of debris is to be taken to the Community Gardens for composting



Failure to comply will possibly result in the closure of the recycle facility.
