Village of Midway Economic Diversification Plan

The Village of Midway is pleased to announce the completion of the first part of the Midway and Boundary Region Economic Diversification plans. The plans were created from funding received through the Province of BC's Rural Economic Diversification and Infrastructure Program (REDIP). Midway was the lead applicant for the project due to the significant economic impact that was felt in the region with the closure of Vaagen Mill.

Over the course of the project the level of community engagement was exceptional – Over 200 residents and businesses across the region participated online and over 130 in person far exceeding expectations of local engagement.

Community Futures Boundary was hired on as the Project Manager and Lochaven Consulting was chosen to complete the project. Lochaven, who has done several recent projects in the Boundary Region, spent time across the Boundary meeting with both residents and businesses to put together the final report.

More stable jobs, opportunities for youth, and citizen attraction were all identified by the community as areas of priority while they also heard how much the region values cultural preservation, environmental sustainability, and quality of life.

The final report provided a list of Strategic Priorities and Actions that the Village of Midway will look to work towards in the next phase of the project. Some of these priorities include focusing efforts on the mitigation of impacts to both impacted workers and businesses as well as supporting local entrepreneurs, the expansion of local businesses as well as being ready for inbound investment opportunities.
