Water Restrictions - The Province has recently elevated the Kettle River watershed drought level to Level 3 effective Wednesday August 9th.

We are asking everyone to reduce non-essential water usage to help keep water in our reservoirs at acceptable levels to ensure we can maintain water for critical activities such as firefighting, drinking, and cooking.

Effective immediately, watering of yards and gardens is restricted to 2 hours per day per household, anytime between the hours of 6:00 pm and 10:00 am.

On your own well? Remember that all Village water comes from the same aquifer and your use also contributes to the lower water levels even if you don't think it does.
