Midway Partnership Fund - Will be accepting Letters of Intent for 2025 grant funding until April 30, 2025 at 4pm.

Application forms can be picked up from the Village Office. Grant proposals must focus on ideas within the geographical area of the Village of Midway. The partnership will consider a wide range of creative projects designed for the benefit of a maximum number of people in the Midway area. Funded activities that take an innovated approach to community concerns or provide a direct service to the community of Midway are preferred. Applications for these funds are reviewed in the spring of each year by the Midway Partnership Fund Directors.

Midway Community Centre Project Update

- The Midway Community Centre project is progressing well. Inside construction works have been the focus over the last couple of months. The Village's architect attended the site at the end of March to review excavation work, lower floor slab openings for underground plumbing and new mechanical ducting openings. The Village is regularly updated by the project team and any questions are being dealt with in a timely manner to avoid delays to the project.

Bylaw No 542 - Prohibit Feeding of

Deer - At the July 18, 2022 Regular Meeting, Council passed a bylaw to prohibit the feeding of deer within the boundaries of The Village of Midway. Section 2 and 3 of the bylaw reads:

2. Prohibition

2.1 No person shall feed deer or cause deer to be fed.

2.2 No person shall permit deer to be fed on property he or she occupies as a permanent or semi-permanent place of residence.

3. Offence

3.1 Every person who contravenes or violates any provision of this Bylaw, or who suffers or permits any act or thing to be done in contravention or in violation of any provision of this Bylaw or who neglects to do or refrains from doing anything required to be done by any provision of this Bylaw, commits an offence and, upon conviction, shall be liable to a maximum fine of up to \$500.00
