Will be closed until the snow is gone in the Spring. **2026 Water & Sewer Rates** - At the November 24, 2025 Regular Council Meeting, Bylaw 578 - Water Services Rates Amendment and Bylaw 579 - Sewer Services Rates Amendment were adopted. For 2026, the water rate has increased by 5% and sewer by 6%. An annual single family residential dwelling cost will be as follows: Water - \$304.30, Sewer - \$310.10. If you have both services it will be a total annual cost of \$614.40.

Accessibility Advisory Committee - The Village of Midway is looking to fill a vacancy on the Accessibility Advisory Committee. The purpose of the Committee is to assist the Village in identifying barriers to individuals interacting within the Village, while also advising the Village how to remove and prevent those barriers. Persons with disabilities and persons representing a disability-serving organization are encouraged to apply. The Committee meets two to three times a year and works on developing priorities for Council consideration. Members are not eligible for compensation for their services.

<u>Plowing and Boulevards</u> - With the snow removal season upon us, residents are reminded to **keep all**

boulevards clear of vehicles and other obstructions to ensure Public Works can effectively remove snow in a timely matter. This includes rocks and other objects that can freeze to the



ground potentially causing damage to Municipal equipment.

Responsible Pet Owners - The Village of Midway wishes to remind pet owners of sections within the Village's Animal Control Bylaw No. 438, 2012 and Noise Control Bylaw No. 475, 2015, that relate to noise.

Bylaw No. 438 - Animal Control.

Section 8 & 9: Noise

- 8: Owners must not allow any dog, cat or animal to disturb the quiet, peace, rest, enjoyment, comfort, or convenience of persons at two or more residences nearby through barking, cries, or other noises.
- 9: Owners must not permit a dog, cat or animal to call, cry or bark for 15 minutes or longer, in a manner audible outside the property, when such noise is deemed objectionable by the Bylaw Enforcement Officer and likely to disturb others' peace and comfort.

Bylaw No. 475 - regulating or prohibiting the creation of disturbing noises within the Village.

- 3. General Regulations
- a) Between the hours of 11:00pm and 7:00am, no person shall make or cause, or permit to be made or caused, any noise in or on a public or private place which disturbs, or tends to disturb the quiet, pease, rest, enjoyment, comfort, or convenience of any person or persons in the neighbourhood or vicinity.
- b) No person being the owner, tenant or occupier of real property shall allow or permit such real property to be used so that noise or sound which occurs thereon or emanates therefrom, disturbs or tends to disturb the quiet, peace, rest enjoyment, comfort or convenience of any person or persons on the same piece of property or in the neighbourhood or vicinity
- d) No person shall own, keep or harbour any animal or bird which by its cries disturbs or tends to disturb the peace, quiet, rest or tranquility of the surrounding neighbourhood or the public at large.

Winter has arrived!

With the arrival of the winter (and snow) season the Village of Midway is asking residents to do their part in helping our Public Works crew make the snow removal process more efficient.

The Public Works crew will follow Council's policy on snow removal priorities.

As per Risk Management Policy No. 310 - Snow Removal & Sanding Policy - the Village will provide residential plowing and sanding when there is an accumulation of a minimum of 2 inches of snow on the streets.

An Important Reminder

Please ensure ALL vehicles, RVs, trailers, basketball nets, decorative features (i.e. rocks), etc. are stored on your own property and not on the boulevard (or close to the boulevard) to provide easy access for snow removal equipment. Items left on the boulevard can cause damage to municipal equipment - if damage does occur then the property owner could be held liable for the cost to fix the damaged equipment. We thank you in advance for helping out our crews this winter.

How you can help keep Midway safe this winter

- · Park your vehicles in your driveway and not on the street.
- Avoid placing snow from your driveway back into the street. Less snow will be pushed into your driveway by
 passing plow trucks and you won't create a potentially dangerous situation for motorists.
- If you can, help your neighbour with snow removal.

The Village's number one priority is ensuring all roads are cleared as soon as possible.

FAQs Here are some commonly asked questions we receive after a snowfall

Why does the snow plow leave a windrow in my driveway? Snow must be plowed to the curb or right hand side of the road. Although the plow operator puts down the gate at every driveway, sometimes the snow is higher than the gate and snow comes off the blade. When clearing your driveway, try to pile the snow on the right side (standing in your driveway and looking towards the street). This can help reduce the amount of snow that is pushed onto your driveway when the snow plow passes.

Can I place the snow from my driveway onto the traveled portion of the street? Residents are encouraged to avoid pushing or blowing snow from their driveway into the street because it could cause a dangerous situation for motorists. By placing the snow back onto the roadway after the plow truck has gone by creates issues as the plow may need to do an additional run down your street to clear the snow. This causes delays and increases costs and staff time.

When will our street be plowed? The streets are prioritized based on the Snow Removal & Sanding Policy No. 310. To view a copy of the Snow Removal & Sanding Policy please visit our website at www.midwaybc.ca for further information.
