Branches or bushes that have been pruned must have a diameter of 6" or less.

2026 Property Taxes - Property taxes fund key Village services such as roads, parks, recreation, community facilities, and fire protection, to name a few. The Village receives an annual Small Communities Grant which helps cover operational costs and reduce pressure on local taxes.

Inflation has increased municipal costs across B.C., and in 2025 the Village also saw a sharp drop in Class 4 Major Industry assessments.

To balance fiscal responsibility with residents' well-being, Council approved a 10% municipal tax increase for all assessment classes at its May 11, 2025 Special Council meeting. Please contact the Village office with any questions.

Property Tax Notices - Tax notices were mailed last week and include a summary of the average increase based on assessed value. The Village also collects property taxes for other taxing authorities, including the Regional District of Kootenay Boundary, the West Kootenay-Boundary Regional Hospital District, school and police taxes, the BC Assessment Authority, and the Municipal Finance Authority. The deadline for paying taxes and utility fees is Thursday July 2, 2026 at 4:30pm. Any outstanding amounts will incur a 10% penalty. The Village can accept cash, cheque, e-transfer or debit (no credit cards) as payment. E-transfers can be sent to: midwayfinance@shaw.ca Please include your property address or roll # in the comment field. Post-dated cheques to July 2, 2026 are accepted but post-marks will not be accepted. Please remember that if you haven't paid for your Water and Sewer utilities that they are also due by July 2, 2026. Homeowner grants are being accepted by the Provincial Government again this year.

Water Restrictions - Public Works has already noticed a large increase in water usage since the brief warm spell at the start of May. Please remember that watering restrictions are always in effect per Bylaw No. 413 and that sprinkling (irrigating) lawns and gardens between the hours of 10:00 am and 6:00 pm is prohibited. On your own well? Remember that all Village water comes from the same aquifer and your use also contributes to the lower water levels. We are expecting a hot summer and we can all see the river is below the levels we have been seeing the last couple of years. Further water restrictions should be expected this summer.
