Campfire Ban – Effective at 12 .p.m. (noon) Pacific Time on Thursday, July 23, 2026, Category 1 campfire will be prohibited throughout the Southeast Fire Centre.

A Category 1 campfire refers to any fire that burns:

- No larger than 0.5 metres in height and 0.5 metres in width
- Used for recreational purposes or by a First Nation for ceremonial purposes

Also prohibited are the following equipment and activities:

- Air curtain burners
 - Carbonizers
 - Fireworks, as defined in the Fireworks Act of BC
 - Binary exploding targets
 - Burn barrels or burn cages of any size or description
 - Controlled air incinerators
 - Sky lanterns
 - Wood fired hot tubs, wood fired pizza ovens, and other wood fired devices unless vented through a structure that has a flue and is incorporated in a building.
- This prohibition does not include the use of outdoor stoves. As per the Wildfire Regulation, an outdoor stove is a CSA-rated or ULC-rated device used outdoors for cooking, heat or ambiance that burns charcoal briquettes, liquid fuel or gaseous fuel and has a flame height that is less than 15 cm tall.

Water Restrictions - Residents are reminded that watering restrictions are always in effect per Bylaw No. 413 and that sprinkling (irrigating) lawns and gardens between the hours of 10:00 am and 6:00 pm is prohibited. Are you on your own well? All Village water comes from the same aquifer and your use contributes to lower water levels.

Midway Community Hall Upgrade Project - A special thank you to the residents of the Village of Midway for your patience as we complete the final stages of the Community Hall. We are currently inspecting and reporting deficiencies with the assistance of the Building Inspector, Fire Chief, Public Works, and Council representatives. The Contractor and Architect are working to complete the requests. It is imperative that items are addressed prior to occupancy, and to avoid additional costs to the project budget. Sound panels will be professionally installed in the main hall. The commercial dishwasher will be calibrated; an additional sink and a drying rack will be installed. We are currently working on directional signage, final items including hanging the local artist paintings, cleaning the hall and preparing for the Health Inspection. Once complete all the items in storage will be returned to the hall. We will keep you up to date as we complete the final stages, and then prepare for the grand opening of the hall.
