Kettle River Watershed - Provincial Drought Level 5 - The Province has elevated the Kettle River watershed to a Drought Level 5. Conditions in the West Boundary are drier compared to the east Boundary.

The three Provincial groundwater observation wells, located in Beaverdell, Midway and Grand Forks, continue to show record low water levels for this time of year.

The Village has implemented water restrictions to help reduce the risk of water shortages.

Village of Midway and Prima Health Sign Agreement to Sustain Local Medical Services

Midway, BC — August 13, 2026

The Village of Midway and Prima Health Cooperative have signed an agreement to sustain medical services for residents of Midway and the surrounding area, ensuring the community retains reliable access to care during a period of transition.

The agreement comes as the community works to secure ongoing physician coverage for the Midway clinic. Prima Health is actively recruiting physicians to provide interim care; a part-time physician is expected to begin in late September.

What This Means for Patients

Patients currently on the clinic panel will remain in the clinic's electronic medical record (EMR) system and will be connected to a provider as soon as physician coverage is confirmed — no re-registration required. In the interim, residents can access medical care through KB Access, Prima Health's virtual and in-person care service or seek care through other online services, Urgent Primary Care in Castlegar or emergency care at Boundary District Hospital. A list of available primary care options is also available at www.kbhcr.ca.

Temporary physician recruitment is actively underway, and the full-time physician posting has already attracted interest.

"The Village of Midway is committed to ensuring its residents have access to the healthcare services they need," said Mayor Doug McMynn, of the Village of Midway. "Our partnership with Prima Health provides a clear path forward — both for immediate access to care and for the long-term sustainability of the Midway clinic."

"Prima Health is proud to support the Midway community and to help stabilize the clinic," said Pat Dooley, Board Chair of PRIMA Health. "Through KB Access, patients have a trusted option for care while we work to restore full clinic services as quickly as possible."

Patients can also access care through other online health clinics as needed. KB Access is an option provided by a local team of Kootenay Boundary physicians providing interim care for unattached patients. www.kbaccess.ca

QUALIFICATIONS FOR OFFICE

A person is qualified to be nominated, elected, and to hold office as a member of local government if they meet the following criteria:

- Canadian citizen;
- 18 years of age or older on general voting day [insert date of general voting day];
- resident of British Columbia for at least 6 months (date) immediately before the day nomination papers are filed [insert date] and
- not disqualified under the *Local Government Act* or any other enactment from voting in an election in British Columbia or being nominated for, being elected to or holding the office, or be otherwise disqualified by law.

WATER RESTRICTIONS EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY
UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE

Due to current provincial drought conditions, the Village is implementing water restrictions to reduce the risk of water shortages for residents and the environment. The Province will monitor our efforts to improve conditions in the Kettle River watershed. If water reductions are not sufficient, it may restrict or suspend water use later in the season.

We are asking everyone to reduce non-essential water usage to help keep water in our reservoirs at acceptable levels to ensure we can maintain water for critical activities such as firefighting, drinking, and cooking.

Effective immediately, **watering of yards and gardens is restricted to 2 hours per day per household**, anytime between the hours of 6:00 pm and 10:00 am.

The Village of Midway reserves the right to disconnect water service for violations of regulations or wasteful water use. A minimum \$50.00 fee will apply before service is restored.

On your own well? All Village water comes from the same aquifer, so your use also contributes to lower water levels.
